Because of our degree's unique emphasis on practical application, you will select, conduct and present a research project and complete Work Integrated Learning (WIL) in certain streams during your third year. you graduate with essential work skills such as critical thinking, and being innovative and adaptable to change, effective problem-solving, collaborating in teams and communicatingeffectively.
